Leo John (Jack) Mack passed away peacefully on Set. 18,2020, at the age of 94 after struggling with dementia.

Jack was born in Molson, Wa to Lester John (Bub) and Pearl Eva (Hirst) Mack on Dec 11, 1925. He attended school at Chesaw and Molson and joined the US Navy when he was 17. He served in the US Navy from 1943-1946 in the Asiatic and Pacific Theaters. He moved to Coulee Dam, Wa where he worked for the Bureau of Reclamation and met his first wife, Bertha Maki, who preceded him in death in May of 1961. Jack and his children moved to Dutch John, Utah where he worked at Flaming Gorge Dam where he met and married Jody in Aug 1966. He left the Bureau of Reclamation in 1967 and with Jody and her kids they moved to Chelan, Wa where he worked for Douglas County PUD until he retired in 1986.

Jack belonged to the VFW, Chelan Eagles, American Legion, Lake Chelan Sportsman's Club and the NRA. He loved to hunt and fish and help his family with construction projects. He knew how to do everything! He loved spending time with his grand and great grandkids. Jack was a very loving and kind man and he is greatly missed.
