Larry Bruce “Ozzie” Morley passed away on July 10, 2024, of dementia, after a short stay at Casa Mia Adult Family Home. He was born on September 3, 1941, in Colville, WA, to Garret Bruce “Gary” Morley and Merle Etta (Matthews) Morley. He attended Brewster High School and graduated with the class of 1959.

On May 20, 1963, Ozzie married Albert Rae “Mumma” Morley. He attended Eastern Washington University, where he graduated with a BA in Business, on March 17, 1972. He worked at Mumma Trucking as the bookkeeper in the ‘70’s and 80’s, then worked at Central Pre-Mix as a driver in Auburn, WA, in the ‘90’s, and retired from the Spokane office in 2004. He then worked another decade for the Ritzville Golf Course as the Marshall, from 2004-2014.

Ozzie was a member of the Teamsters. He also enjoyed a great game of golf and volunteered as an AAU Baseball and Basketball coach, as well as a Little League Coach.

Ozzie is preceded in death by his wife, Alberta, in May of 2022. He is survived by his sons: Shannon Morley of Spokane, WA, and Cory Morley (Kim), of Methow, WA; daughter, Tracey Morley of Lake Stevens, WA; granddaughter, Madison Morley (Jack Zalinski) of Spokane, WA; grandsons: Corbin Morley
