“ *By coincidence I found a note on the Internet saying that Mrs. Ruth Sorensen had passed away. I was very sorry to see that note, but it brought back some memories.*

My grandfather had a brother called Lauritz Sorensen. He migrated to the States around 1920 and changed his first name to Louis as the Americans found his real name too hard to pronounce. He married an American girl Ruth.

After the war, Louis and Ruth visited Denmark. I believe it was in 1946 or 47. I was only 6 at that time, but I do recall the visit as Louis showed us a film of a small plane flying over his apple orchard. He also showed us a picture of their daughter Karen, who had just won a beauty contest of some kind.

After that we all lost contact until I found them in 1982. I was with my family in Canada, and we drove by motorhome from Calgary to Los Angeles. I thought of Louis and his family when I saw all the apple orchards in Washington. But I realized that it was like looking for a needle in a haystack. On our way back to Calgary we stopped at a fruit stand in Washington - just outside Chelan to buy some fruit. I asked an elderly woman in the fruit stand if by any chance she knew about Louis Sorensen.

She then told me that Louis was dead but Ruth was still alive - and lived next to her in Chelan.

I did not have time to go back to Chelan but I phoned Ruth from the fruit stand. She was not at home - she was in the airport to pick up a family member for a family gathering the same evening. Her daughter Karen answered the phone and when I told her who I was, she told me that the whole family thought that all the Danish family did not live any more.

We went back to Denmark and I wrote Ruth a long letter. Within 2 years we had several visits from our American family - including Ruth and her son Roger.

We have since then again lost contact with our American family, but
